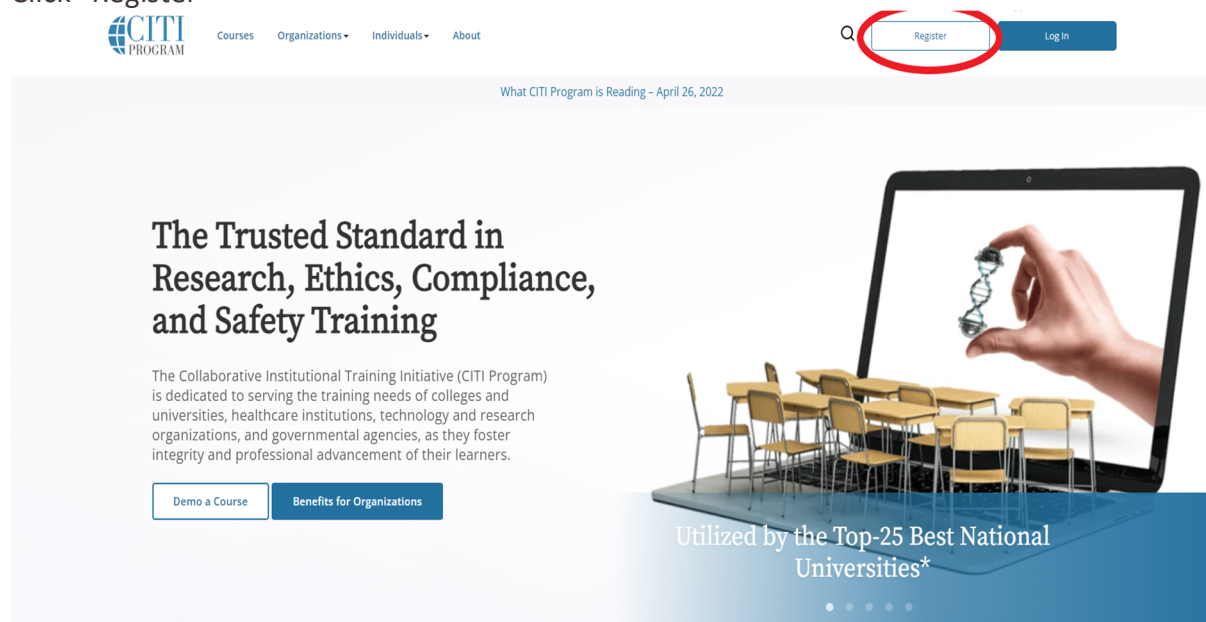


CITI- Notes before getting started:
