

All Investigators are required to disclose their significant financial and personal interests, and those of their Family Members, their Foreign Interests, and their sponsored and non-sponsored research projects.

An Investigator is any person who shares the responsibility of Conducting Research. Conducting Research includes the design, development, testing, evaluation, conduct, reporting, review, and oversight of a program of scientific inquiry.

- ➡ The term “Investigator” includes any person, regardless of title or position, who is responsible for Conducting Research performed by or under the auspices of the University.
- ➡ The term “Investigator” is **not limited** to the Principal Investigator (PI), Co-PI, Co-Investigator, Project Director (PD), Co- PD, Senior/Key Personnel.

Who is an Investigator?

Investigators



- Individuals responsible for the design, development, testing, evaluation, conduct, reporting, review, and oversight of a program of scientific inquiry.
- Individuals who are directly involved in the research intervention or consenting or evaluation of human research subjects.
- Students, trainees, collaborators, volunteers and consultants if those individuals share responsibility in the design, development, testing, evaluation, conduct, reporting, review, and oversight of a program of scientific inquiry.

Non-Investigators



- Individuals whose performance is purely ancillary.
- Hospital or office staff who provide only ancillary or intermittent care as a service.
- Hospital or office staff who do not make direct and significant contributions to the research data.
